

FIELD TESTS NEXT SEASON. War Will Then Be Begun on the Sage

While the sage rat does not infest the Bend country, it is quite a nuisance surrounding Madras. Speak-Pioneer says:

In a recent letter to the editor of of the Department of Agriculture and is conducting experiments at Pullman, Washington, states that he does not expect to be able to conduct field tests with the inocu- possibilities and no doubt, public lation of sage rats in this locality, sentiment on the drink question during the present season, but if will be lifted to a higher level during the present season, but if possible he expects to visit this section soon, to acquaint himself with conditions, with a view to beginning the field tests here early next season.

Some time ago a box of sage rats was sent to Mr. Piper for experimental purposes, the experiments being conducted at the experiment station at Pullman. These tests have so far proved highly satisfactory, and Mr. Piper is confident that the sage rat pest will be entirely eradicted by this process. The present experiments are being conducted on caged rats, the rats being inoculated with a virus which produces a deadly contageous desease, and the results being carefully studied with a view to ascertaining not only the effect upon the rats, but the possible danger of contagion to other animals. Later field tests will be made, the rats to be inoculated and turned loose.

Mr. Piper has requested a new shipment of the sage rats from this locality, in order to continue the experiments at Pullman, and more rats will be gathered at once, if Black Langshan Chickens possible, and shipped to him. As soon as the experiments with this lot are completed, he expects to wisit this section in person, to study REDMOND.
