

#### National Irrigation Congress.

An advance copy of the offical call of the Fifteenth National Irrigation Congress has been seceived by The Bulletin. It is issued from the headquarters of the congress at Sacramento, California, and announces that this important convention will be held in that city September 2-7 inclusive next. The document resites the purposes of the congress, invites the appointment of delegates by organized bodies of all kinds, and anmounces special railway rates over all rallway lines to California. An Interstate Irrigation and Forestry Exposition, the California State Fair and special harvest excursions over California are among the entertainment features promised those who attend.

The ourposes of the congrass are deciared to be "Save the forests, store the floods, reclaim the deserts, make homes on the land," and all who are interested in these objects or in any of them are invited to participate in the deliberations and thereby contribute to a wise direction of national policies and development of practical methods of conserving and developing the great natural resources of

the country.

The personnel of the congress, as stated in the call, includes the president and vice-president of the United States, representatives, governors of states and representatives, governors of states and territories, members of state and territorial legistatures and state irrigation, forestry and other commissions. Delegates may be appointed by governors of states and territories, mayors of cities, county governing boards, official and unofficial public bodies, and organizations of every kind including agricultural, horticultural and commercial, as we'll as boards of trade, chambers of commerce
