for this line has already been made
and plans are on foot for the con-
struction of the road.

Sees Irrigated District.

Last year Mr. Stanley spent some
time in Central Oregon with Mr.
Harriman, taking him in his auto-
mobile over the irrigated sections
of the district and urging at that
time the construction of the Central
Oregon line by Mr. Harriman.

Governor Chamberlain's attitude on
the Central Oregon transportation
question is well known not only to Mr. Harriman but to the
people of the state. There is no
uncertainty, therefore, as to what
course of action will be urged by
him in the discussion of the rail-
road situation during his stay at
Pelican Bay.

It is because of the known atti-
tude of all three of Mr. Harriman's
prospective guests and the added
official connection of Mr. O'Brien
with Mr. Harriman and the O. R.
& N. that the invitation extended
at this time is looked upon as bearing
a deep significance. It is believed
to be well within the range
of probability that the result of the
conference will be the commence-
ment of construction work on the
long expected and much hoped for
road through the Cascades and on
through the central part of the
state to a junction with the main
line of the O. R. & N. at or near
Ontario.

The automobile bearing the three
distinguished visitors reached Bend
about 7:30 o'clock Saturday even-
ing. The night was spent at Bend
and they proceeded on their way
Sunday, getting started about 7
o'clock in the morning.

Condon Line Begins Construction.
Work on the building of the elec-
tric line from Condon into this sec-
tion was begun at Condon on Aug-
ust 15, and it is said the first 40
miles will be completed in time to
handle the 1909 wheat crop. This
is the electric line that is to be
built from Condon to Fossil and
then on to Madras and to Bend
with a line also to Prineville. This
line will also be built over the Cas-
cades to connect with some railroad
in the valley.

Behind this project are David
Eccles, the Ogden capitalist, and
Portland and California capital,
Eccles seems to be taking an active
part in its promotion. Men who
are interested in this say it is a
certainty and that the work com-
menced at Condon will be carried
out as rapidly as the construction
can be accomplished. A contract
for 200 miles of road, with neces-
sary bridges and power plants, has
been let to the Portland Construc-
tion Company.
