General apathy can defeat us, and nothing else can, unless some fool arises as in the Blaine campaign with the cry of "Rum, Romanism and Rebellion," or some such idiotic nonsense. Those four words defeated Blaine, which goes to show what thin ice we are walking on at all times during a campaign.
