PLANNING THE LIBRARY.

Books Should Run to the Ceiling—A Few Measurements.

The library—of all portions of the house the most intimate, the most sacred, an unassailable fortress, a kingdom of one's own—is there a single place that so distinctly and entirely belongs to the house owner himself as this room? Cosiness, warmth and seclusion should here be aimed at, says indoors and out. The room should be dignified without being ceremonious, sedate without stiffness. Here may one curl up in a comfortable chair and nibble a book as serenely as Dr. Johnson used to gobble his dinner.

If there is not a sufficient number of books to run to the ceiling, fill out the walls with warm brown chestnut or walnut or eypress or oak panels. They will inclose and warm it even during the dreariest of snowstorms. If an expensive material as wood cannot be employed for the covering of the walls, use a noncommittal burlap of one uniform tone, with perhaps merely a texture of weave or surfacing, just to keep it from looking licked and bodiless.

The bookcases are a difficult question and should, if possible, run directly to the ceiling. If the owner has not a sufficient quantity of books to make this feasible, he may run them one-third or two-thirds up the sides of the room. A half-way subdivision in an eleven foot room is never pleasing. Whether they be high or low, do not make the lower part of the room a library and the upper part a picture or chrome gallery, and, above all, avoid a knickknack collection on the upper shelves. Busts or medallions of authors may, however, be introduced in a dignified manner.

The width, depth and length of the shelves are all of importance. Shelves should be placed on movable strong metal pegs in order that they may be at any time varied. They should be made of strong material in hard wood, one or one and a quarter inches thick and not over three feet long. Eight inches deep, instead of ten or twelve, is generally the case, will suffice for most books. As a rule, in calculating the requisite space required for the housing of a library eight to ten volumes to the running foot should be adequate. The provision for expansion should naturally be considered in all libraries if one is not to be driven to such expedients as De Quincey, who finally kept his choicest volumes in the family wash tub. Roughly speaking, a thousand volumes require from eighty to a hundred square feet of floor measurement.
