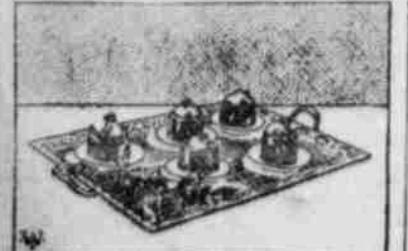

Bread That Won't Rise.
When your bread fails to rise, don't throw the dough away, and by all means don't attempt to bake it, for it will certainly be unfit to eat, says the Delineator. Instead, take a teaspoonful of flour, two heaping teaspoonfuls of baking powder, a scant teaspoonful of salt and enough warm milk or water to make a sticky dough; work this in with the other dough; roll flat and cut into the shape of biscuits. Then bake quickly. The result will be a lot of biscuits so nice and light that everybody will agree that they are superior to the ordinary soda or baking powder variety. The proportions given will be found sufficient if there was not more than a quart of flour used in making the first dough.

Cranberry Jelly Cups.
A simple way to serve the jelly individually is to mold it in cups and when cold remove some of the center by dipping a warm spoon in and turning it out the jelly. This cavity can be filled with seasoned whipped cream passed through a star tube, so as to form stars on top.
