ROOSEVELT, JR., AT WORK.

Son of President Poos in Full Day at Carpet Factory.
Teddy Roosevelt, Jr., is on the payroll at the Thompsonville, Conn., carpet works. From a free and easy life



he has passed to the ranks of the dinner pail brigade, a subject of the steam whistle that sounds the time for the beginning work and for ending it. He is getting \$5 a week. Soon he is to be transferred to another department with a raise to \$8.

Teddy was installed in the office when he came to work. He was given a place in the clerical force, which is composed chiefly of young women. The office working hours are from 8 to 12 and 1 to 5. When he has greeted there some ideas of the business, the first of which is that the man who works with his brains is tied to his task eight hours, and the man who labors with his hands 11, 12 and 14 hours. Teddy will be transferred to the sorting room, which is a matter of dirt and overalls, real work and long hours. It is in this department that the wool is picked and assorted into grades. The working hours are from 6:45 to 12, and from 12:45 to 6:15, and are long enough to give the young man time to learn about the grades of wool that come to Thompsonville from all parts of the world. He will also find out the kinds of wool that go into Axminster, Brussels, Wilton and the other brands of carpets. He will pass from the wool room to other departments.

T. R., Jr.'s plunge into business has raised a question as to the careers of other sons of presidents. Robt. T. Lincoln, son of President Lincoln, is a sleeping car magnate, being president of the Pullman Co. In earlier life he was a lawyer. Gen. F. D. Their brother, Abram, is an architect.

CONCRETE ON A NEW PLAN.
Method Followed by an Engineer on the Pacific Coast.
Particulars are given in the Engineering Record of a concrete wall that has recently been constructed in a rather unusual manner by J. F. Lyman of Modesto, Cal. Between the framing forming the outer and inner faces of the wall collapsible hollow cylinders somewhat less in diameter than the thickness of the wall were placed vertically at intervals, the cylinders having previously been perforated with several holes. The object of this was to drain the water from the fresh concrete as the latter was placed round the cylinders.
The concrete having been filled in round the cylinders, it was allowed to set during the night and the water which had collected in the cylinders was then pumped out and the cylinders were withdrawn, the space which they occupied being filled with concrete. It is stated that the hollow cylinders contained from two to six inches of clean water at the end of from ten to twelve hours, the water having drained from the concrete.
The object in providing this extra drainage was to procure a uniform set throughout the mass of concrete. It appears that a large number of concrete structures have been built by Mr. Lyman in this way, including the head gates, waste weirs, drops and highway bridges on a large irrigation works. Concrete laid by this method is said to be unusually free from cracks and is very uniform in strength.
