

ENLARGED HOMESTEADS.

List of Lands in The Dalles District Subject to Entry under New Law.

Following is a list of lands within The Dalles land district which are subject to entry under the Enlarged Homestead Act of February 10, 1909. Under this act and on certain lands, a homestead entryman is entitled to 320 acres.

The designation of lands under this act does not permit entries to be made if the lands are not subject to homestead entry, or are under suspension or withdrawal, or in a forest or other reservation. The removal of the suspension, withdrawal or reservation of the lands subjects them to this act, if otherwise subject to homestead entry.

Two Indians Marry.

Peter Brunos, a former Warm-springs Indian, now located at North Yakima, and Indian Sally of Cello, were granted a license to wed by County Clerk F. F. Angle Monday afternoon. On requesting the license of the county clerk Brunos said: "This woman like this man Get Fr. Brongest to make um tight." Father Brongest being out of town the two Indians were married by Justice J. A. Douthit shortly after securing the license. The witnesses to the ceremony were Wasco Charley, an Indian, and Chief of Police J. H. Harper. Brunos said he believed in marriage the same as white people and wished to have the ceremony performed according to law. This is the first marriage license issued to an Indian by County Clerk Angle.—The Dalles Optimist.

Fossil Bones Discovered.

A bed of prehistoric fossil bones has been recently discovered in Pueblo valley in northern Humboldt county, Nevada, near the Oregon line. The discovery is in the vicinity of Thousand Spring creek and already a party of professors and students from the Uni-



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versity of California are inspecting the find and gathering specimens. A number of skulls and other bones of the mammoth and other extinct animals have been found. The country contains a petrified forest—beds of lignite coal, and in places some fine opals were picked up. The opal bed has been located and filed on but the bones are there for the first appropriator.

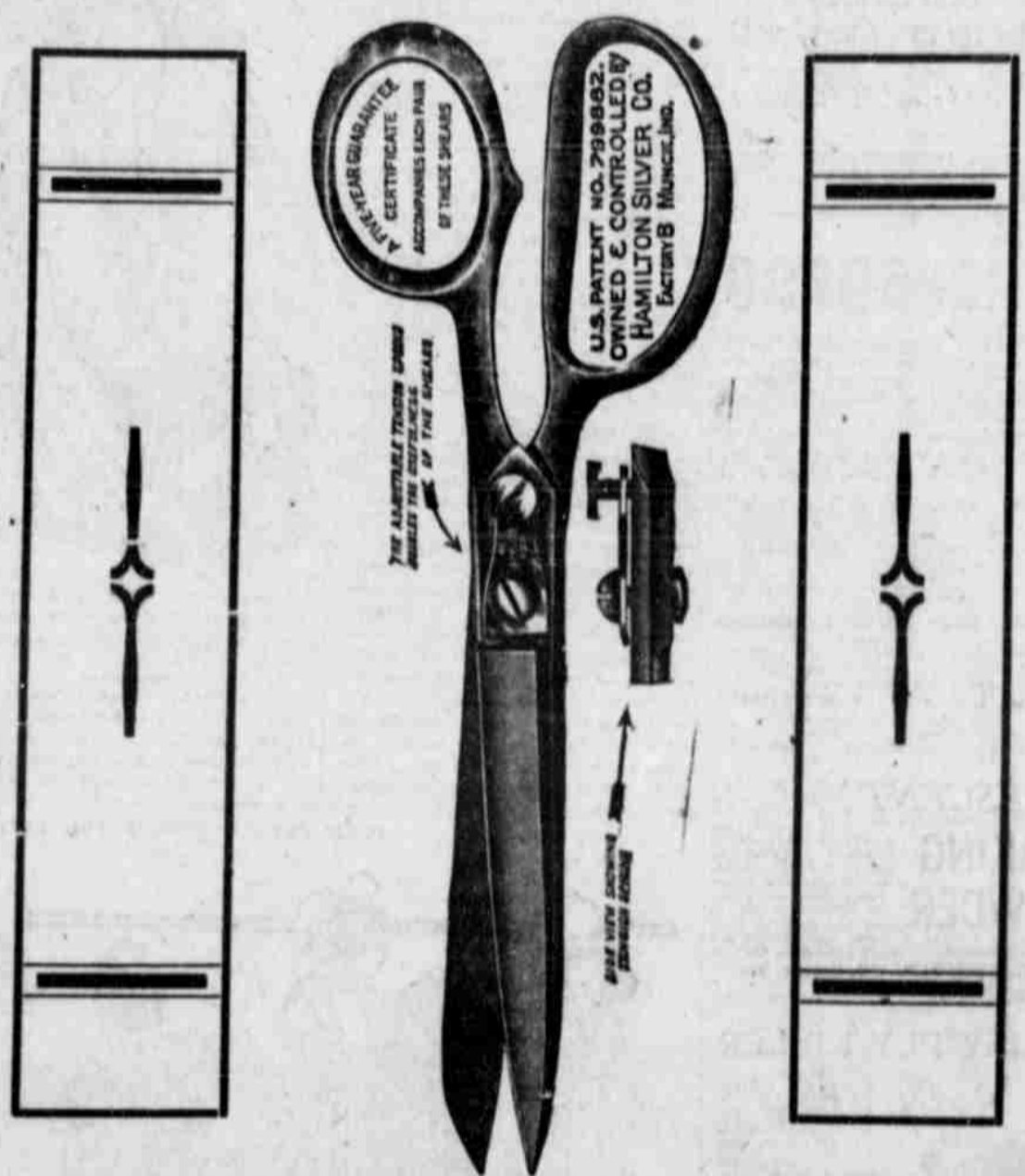
