

**FOUND NOT GUILTY.**

**Jury Acquits H. J. Overturf in Suit Brought by Deputy Game Warden.**

The case of the State vs. H. J. Overturf, as manager of the Pilot Butte Development Company, was heard in Justice Scofield's court on last Thursday, and a verdict of not guilty was returned by the jury.

It will be remembered that the suit was instituted by J. S. Lilly, deputy fish and game warden, the complaint being that the defendant company had allowed refuse from its sawmill to get into the river. At the trial the State failed utterly to produce any evidence to show that this had been done, and the State's case was further weakened by the fact that the P. B. D. Co had built a pond for use by the mill under the specific directions of a former state fish and game warden. It is freely stated by those present at the trial that the whole thing was a farce, and that there was absolutely no evidence that the mill company had violated the law in any way whatever.

The state was represented by Attorney C. S. Benson and the defendant by J. M. Lawrence.

On February 7, Walter Clark, a young man living on the upper river, was arraigned before Justice Scofield on the charge of having killed a deer. The boy voluntarily appeared for trial and pleaded guilty. He was fined \$50, but on account of his behavior in the matter and other extenuating circumstances, the fine was imposed in
