### DATES ARE SET FOR 1910 WOOL SALES

The dates for Oregon's annual wool sales have been announced as follows: Pendleton, May 24 and June 10; Pilot Rock, May 27 and June 11; Echo, May 25; Heppner, May 31 and June 17; Vale, June 13; Ontario, June 14; Shaniko, June 7, June 21 and July 7; Enterprise and Walla Walla county, July 12.

Under the sales date system, the growers hold their clips, concentrate them at some one of the several points decided upon, and upon the dates fixed the buyers offer sealed bids upon each of the clips. The grower may reject any or all bids. The system has proved very satisfactory.
