Evidently the Spring Fever, or something akin to it, has got into the blood of Brother Shaw. At all events, sundry promising piles of lumber have made their appearance on his lot opposite the Hotel Bend, and after a winter of waiting it begins to look as if the promised emporium was about to spring into being. The building next to the Innes & Davidson barber shop is well under way, the new stores opposite the postoffice are being occupied. Nick Smith announces the immediate erection of a store building and—well, everyone in Bend's a-building, and the sound of the carpenter's hammer has completely drowned that of the knocker.

Bend Bank's Birthday.

On March 20th the First National Bank of Bend was a year old, for on that date the new institution took over the affairs of the Central Oregon Banking and Trust Co. A comparison of the figures indicative of the bank's business when it entered the field and now offers the best evidence of its prosperous growth, one that may fairly be said equally to indicate the growth of Bend itself.

A year ago the bank had 172 depositors and \$21,000 in deposits. Today there are 506 accounts and \$180,000 in deposits. In the hands of 218 persons are \$85,000 in loans, leaving an amount on hand far in excess of the Government requirements.
