DECORATION DAY

JOINT SERVICES HELD HERE

Laidlaw and Bend Veterans Honor the Occasion—Old Soldiers Tell of Their Experiences, Children Decorate Graves.

Memorial Day services were held in Bend on Sunday, at the church and at the cemetery. Ten of the old boys in faded blue and one who wore the gray were among the participants. After the church exercises Mine Host Hunter entertained the veterans with dinner and cigars at the Pilot Butte Inn. At the cemetery special attention was given to the grave of Comrade Holman W. Morrill.

The services at the church began at 2 o'clock with a selection played by the band. After the invocation by the Rev. E. S. Fox the choir sang "Boys of the Old Brigade" and the Rev. J. A. Mitchell gave an old army song, "A Thousand Years." Mr. Fox delivered the occasional address. Mr. Mitchell again sang, the old song "Brave Boys Are They," and Professor Throne played a cornet solo, "The Vacant Chair." Brief talks were made by Comrades Cook, Tweet, Thorp, West, O'Neill and Boydston, who spoke of war time experiences and commented on the lessons of the strife. Comrade O'Neill gave special credit to the women for their part in the great struggle and others endorsed the sentiment, some of them speaking a second time to it. There were also references to the Spanish-American war service and the general opinion expressed was that United States soldiers fought differently then because of the different kind of enemy before them; that in the same circumstances the troops in the later war would have exhibited the same valor as in the conflict of '61-5. They fought in the best way to accomplish their purpose.

Teams and automobiles carried a large number to the cemetery. There was music by fife and drum, prayer by Rev. J. A. Mitchell, the song "Tramp, Tramp, Tramp" by the choir, appropriate remarks by Mr. Mitchell and a selection by the band, after which the children decorated the graves. The only sol-

dier's grave in the Bend cemetery is that of Holman W. Morrill. Comrades Cook, Awbrey, McAllister and Boydston came from Laidlaw to participate in the service. The other veterans live in Bend.
