MAY BUILD ONE SOUTH

Crescent to Klamath in Plan—Activity on Harriman Surveys May Indicate Changing of Natron Cut-Off Route.

CRESSENT, June 13.—J. A. Bechley, former division superintendent for the Illinois Central, with headquarters at Dubuque, Iowa, accompanied by his son, Carlisle, arrived here the latter part of last week and invested in a number of lots. Mr. Bechley will erect a building 50 by 75 feet on his Railroad Avenue lots and will be interested in a telephone line between here and Klamath Falls. Connection will be made with the line at Port Klamath.

Chief Engineer Hood of the Southern Pacific, who was here last week, paid a visit to the Southern Pacific camp at the Hoey ranch twelve miles west. A good wagon road is being built from Lake Odell to Hazel Dell, the present terminus of the construction camps of the Southern Pacific, twenty-nine miles west of the ranch. The company has secured permission from the Interior Department to change its right-of-way through the forest reserve and it is stated that the line will be brought direct into Crescent to hook up with the Harriman line. Assistant Chief Engineer H. P. Hoey is in charge of the force which will shortly be augmented.

Charles Graves of Klamath Falls, formerly owner of the property on which the townsite of Crescent now stands, was the second man to drive an automobile over the new road to Lake Odell. He made the trip in less than two hours, though a portion of the distance is up grade.

Miss Ione Applegate concluded a term of successful teaching of the Crescent school and has returned to her home in the Willamette valley. She will return here next year, it is stated.

The Oregon Trunk crew in charge of Engineer D. Kyle has been ordered to continue surveying to Klamath Falls. The crew up to this week has been engaged on revision of the line from Corral Springs to Crescent. The crew is expected to reach Klamath Falls about July 15th.

E. G. Rourke left for Portland to hurry the shipment of goods for his store here.

F. C. Robinson, landlord of the Crescent Hotel, was a Bend visitor last week.
