VETERANS MEET

SOLDIERS FORM ASSOCIATION

Good Sized Roster of Veterans of Three Wars Hold Interesting Exercises at Laidlaw and Elect Officers.

At the meeting held in Laidlaw on Flag Day, June 14, an organization of Crook County veterans was effected, as well as an extensive and interesting program rendered. The soldiers marched to the church, headed by the Laidlaw Band, where the meeting was presided over by Harmon Cook. After some singing B. F. Nichols gave an interesting account of the Indian wars in Oregon. J. I. West talked on Civil War days and H. P. Myers spoke of experiences in the Spanish War. At an evening session O. C. Young gave a recitation, which was heartily enjoyed. "Why are We Here?" was a paper by Harmon Cook, who also read "The Story of the Flag." One of the most striking events of the gathering was the vivid word picture of prison life at Andersonville given by J. J. West, from his store of personal war-time experiences.

It was decided to style the soldiers' organization the Crook County Oregon Veterans' Association, its membership to comprise veterans of the Indian, Mexican, Civil and Spanish wars, with the provision that sons of these may be elected. John I. West was chosen Commander, Harmon Cook, Adjutant and J. C. Thorp, Quartermaster.

GRAHAM IMMIGRATION AGENT

DEATH IN AUTO ACCIDENT.

Sister of C. M. Davis Killed at North Yakima Recently.

NORTH YAKIMA, Wash., June 14.—Miss Hope Davis and Miss Lina Buckmaster were killed when a train struck the automobile in which they were riding yesterday afternoon. An inquest will be held at 2:30 this afternoon. J. L. Strangeway, the chauffeur, is under arrest. The motor car was struck by Northern Pacific train No. 4 at the D street crossing at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon. There are no gates at the crossing and the view of the tracks is obstructed by box cars.

Miss Buckmaster lived at Naches City, Wash. Miss Davis lived in North Yakima.—Oregon Journal.

Miss Davis was a sister of Mrs. Morrill of Powell Buttes, and of C. M. Davis, of the Homeseekers Land Co. of Bend. Her mother, sister and six brothers survive.
