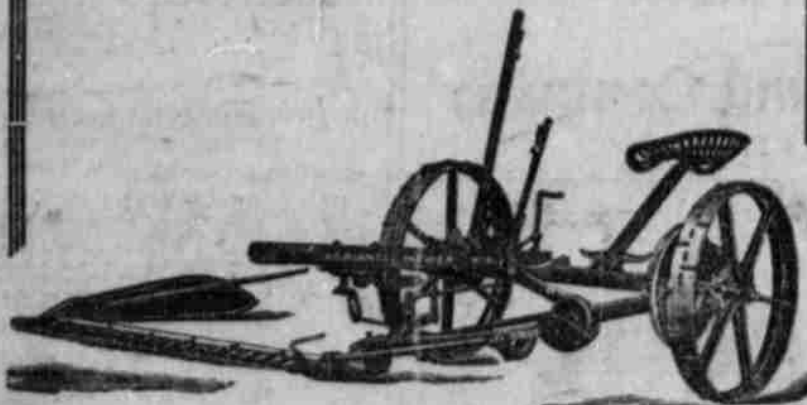

The James E. Reed sawmill, on the Central Oregon canal at the E. A. Smith place, began sawing last Monday. The first work was to get out material for a bridge across the canal, across which most of the logs to be sawed will come.

Jones, Sam Glover, Jim Garrett, Charley Lowe, Bert Clark, George Anton and Arthur Minkler arrived yesterday, all heavily laden with Bend merchandise. They report good roads and plenty of business.

Tremendous Freighting Traffic.
Charles Lowe, who is freighting between Shaniko and Bend, reports that when he stopped at Bolter's last Friday night there were 40 rigs tied up there, averaging 6 horses each. At Shaniko he says he saw 180 head of horses tied in the street, every stable in town being filled to capacity. During the rains every garage was "chock-a-block" and autos were kept on the sidewalk in front of the Columbia Southern hotel under shelter.

Preparing for Electric Light Poles.
Work preparatory to the installation of poles for the electric lighting service is progressing. A large number of poles have been prepared and holes dug for them along the alley extending through blocks 7, 8 and 9. It is understood that the poles will be put in along the alleys.
