## BAND ENTERTAINS CROWD

Music, Speaking, War Time Reminiscences and Good Things to Eat Make Laidlaw Evening Universally Applauded.

Last Saturday night the Laidlaw Band gave a highly successful entertainment in the church at Laidlaw, whose capacity was taxed to the utmost by the big local crowd which turned out and the many visitors from Bend.

After a well played selection by the Band, under the leadership of Prof. Thorne, the Misses Mellie James and Fay Gerking gave a vocal duet which was encored warmly. "My Philosophy" was a clever monologue recitation by O. C. Young, whose hearty reception brought forth another humorous offering concerning "Sturdy Oaks and Clinging Vines." Then the Band played, Prof. Thorne gave a cornet solo and W. M. Dillinbeck recited "At the Grave of Napoleon."

The feature of the evening was J. I. West's talk, "Prison Days in Andersonville." "Dad," a veteran of the Civil War, held his listeners fascinated with his incisive word picture of the horrible scenes in which he himself was an actor in the great Confederate prison, fighting up his wartime story here and there with bits of quaint humor that sent hearty laughter through his audience. From July to march, 64, said Mr. West, while he was in the "Reb" stockade, he had at no time shoes nor shirt nor canvas over him. When exchanged and returned to the lines of blue his weight was but 60 pounds.
