BOARD IS BEGUN

BEND REALTY MEN ORGANIZE

Real Estate Dealers Get Together for the Purpose of Mutual Aid and Form Bend Realty Board.

At a meeting of realty men held last Thursday in the offices of the Home Land Company a real estate men's organization was entered into which choose for itself the title of Bend Realty Board. The organization was the result of a preliminary meeting held the previous week at J. A. Eastes' office, where, at a gathering of practically all the realty men in Bend, the advantages of organization were discussed and a committee to draw up by-laws, etc., was appointed.

Extracts of the by-laws, herewith given, outline the purposes of the organization and the methods of its conduct.

Membership—Its members shall be composed of real estate men who have regular established places of business and who shall conduct same in a manner creditable to the organization.

Expulsion of Members—It shall be the privilege of this organization to reprimand or expel any member who may be proven guilty of business methods or practices discreditable to the organization.

Purposes—The purposes of this organization shall be to promote harmony and a feeling of goodfellowship among its members and to aid in the promotion of enterprises and the best interests of Bend and Central Oregon in general.

Legibility to Vote—Only one of each firm belonging to the Board shall be entitled to vote but the right of discussion is extended to all members of the Board.

Time of Meeting—The regular meeting of the board shall be held on the first Thursday night of each month. Special meetings may be called by the president or by the request of three members of the Board.

Dues—The monthly dues of this Board shall be twenty-five cents (25c) for each member; initiation fees twenty-five (25c).

The following officers were appointed:

President, J. A. Eastes; Vice President, M. J. Morrison; Secretary, C. D. Brown; Treasurer, W. W. Orcutt.

Secretary Brown reports the following charter membership: Home Land Co., J. A. Eastes, Crook County Realty Co., Deschutes Realty Co., Home-Seekers' Land Co., S. J. Spencer, J. L. Byrne, O. C. Henkle and W. R. Riley.

It is the intention of the Board to post lists of its members and to advertise such a list, so that strangers coming in to the town as well as those who have inquiries to make may be informed of the names of firms to whom they may apply for detailed information. Inasmuch as only reputable realty dealers will be permitted to join the organization and as discreditable practices afford grounds for expulsion, the membership list will come to be a sort of roll of honor.

Are the Railroads Harassed?
(Extract from Editorial New York Herald, May 30, 1910)

The only unfavorable element in the business situation is the unfavorable attitude of federal lawmakers and state officials towards the railways and the spirit which would prevent the companies from moderately advancing their charges to offset the increased cost of operation. When the manufacturer is obliged to pay higher prices for raw material and increased wages, he does the only possible thing in the circumstances and correspondingly raises the charge for his product. The railways are obliged to pay increased prices for supplies and higher wages, and it is only reasonably that they should get more for what they sell, namely, transportation.

That they are impelled to raise their charges is plain from current traffic returns showing increased gross takings, while costs of operation have increased in still greater ratio, with resulting decrease in net earnings. Unless the greatest of all industries is permitted to prosper the country cannot be prosperous.—Adv.
