A STRENUOUS DAY

PICNICKERS HAVE HIGH TIME

Runaways, Tight-wire Performance and Impromptu Swimming Stunt Add to Enjoyment of Restful Up-River Party.

Whether it was because of the multitudinous mishaps of the day, or in spite of them, the 20 picnickers who enjoyed Dr. and Mrs. Merrill's hospitality at the Minor Homestead last Sunday had a decidedly pleasant holiday.

From start to finish it was a comedy of errors. A double runaway started the day. As the team driven by Morris Lara came into camp the horses bolted, whereupon the pair presided over by R. B. Gould followed suit out of sympathy. Gould also followed them, over the dash board, the buggy "hanging up" on a stump and the horses proceeding with an assortment of broken harness. The doubletree, singletree and the tongue were badly smashed.

After a much appreciated luncheon served by Mrs. Merrill and the Misses Markel, Young and Richardson, who had been visitors at the ranch for a week, the party, in relays, crossed the river in Dr. Mitchell's boat brought down the river for the purpose. The more strenuous walked down to Benham Falls. Many wished to cross then to the east bank. Whereupon H. J. Overturf stepped into the breach and embarked upon a tight rope trip. Using the wire cable across the river upon which hangs the pulley car of the U. S. G. PURE STREAMS PLEA

California Organization Points Out Necessity of Keeping Water Pure.

A circular issued by the California Club has been brought to the attention of The Bulletin by a Bend citizen, with the request that attention be called to its contents. The circular, under the caption "A Plea for Pure Streams" outlines the vital necessity of keeping the streams, whence comes the country's drinking water, free from contamination. In part, the "Plea" is as follows:

Picnickers: Your enjoyment is lacking without the streams; why destroy their fringed edges, spoil their shade, or render their water unsightly with trash?

Campers: Dig holes to receive all rubbish, neutralize and bury or burn refuse. Do not burden the stream with it.

Housekeepers: Empty no tubs, cleanings of either fish, fowl, animal fruit, vegetable or dairy into your adjacent stream.

Farmers: Do not use arroyos or dry channels for vaults, looking to storms to cleanse them. Think of your neighbor below. Consider the milk supply and the poisoned water for the stock.
