BACK TO OLD MEXICO.

At Seventy-five Old Prospector Returns to Seek Gold.

"Uncle John" Sisemore left Bend recently to spend the winter in Mexico—at just what place he does not know. Away back in 1857 he and a companion were in northern Mexico, probably in the present Mexican state of Chihuahua, and ran across some miners who were "dry washing" fabulously rich gravel. Sisemore was then directed from Humbug creek, in Northern California, where he had been taking \$100 a day out of a placer. Now, after seeing how irrigating canals are made in this section, he is eager to apply water to that rich Mexican placer if he can find it and his 75 years do not in the least discourage him.

From Bend he drove a team to Brownsville. From there he will go for a short visit with his daughter in Roseburg, and then he will pass on to Mexico.
