SETTLERS MEET.

water users under the Central Oregon canal to organize and then call upon the others for co-operation.

Levi Ernst reported that the Powell Butte water users formed an association last spring, but no meeting had been held since April. Nothing had been done but organize with Russell Johnson as president and I. Jones as secretary.

Howard Spining advocated an organization that should have power to do something. He thought it would be necessary to pay for adequate representation before the State Board, to pay for copies of records, etc., and he wanted the association to be in shape to take such action when needed. This would inspire respect and contribute a good deal to the success of the cause. He recommended a goodly initiation fee, not merely 50 cents or \$1 or \$2.

J. M. Lawrence, who was present representing The Bulletin, was called on for suggestions and he commended the idea of organization among the settlers, both by localities or districts and in general for the larger purposes of the irrigation farmers. "It seems lament-

ably true," he said, "that the public interest, the interest of settlers, does not receive proper attention. All private interests are carefully looked after, but the settlers must look out for themselves, and they cannot do this well without organization. I believe you are on the right track."

There was a free and general expression of views by many others present. It was stated that they didn't want their complaints filed by the State Board without action, or referred to some officer or even to the D. I. & P. Co. itself. They were tired of this sort of treatment. "The State Board comes out to inspect," said one, "and sees what the company is pleased to show them; of course they don't see the bad places."

The chair called attention to the fact that this meeting was held under a call for Central Oregon settlers and not for a general organization and deemed it best that the others be consulted before action should be taken affecting them.

On motion of Richardson it was voted that when this meeting adjourns it adjourn to meet again at the same place in two weeks.

Dr. Dencer moved that the chair appoint three settlers to act with the chairman and secretary as a committee on by-laws and resolutions for permanent organization and to consult with other organizations and settlers with reference to the scope of the new association, and to report at the next meeting. The motion carried and Messrs. Richardson, Dencer and Burt were thus appointed, after which the meeting adjourned.
