WOOD FOR SETTLERS FROM RESERVE.

Homesteaders In Southeast Country Will Get Free Fuel and Lumber from Pine Mountain Federal Forests Early this Spring.

MILLICAN, Ore., March 7 .--- Assistant Forest Ranger Hubert E. Derrick, with headquarters at La Pine, Oregon, will be in the vicinity of Pine Mountain as soon as the snow is out of the timber, to confer with homesteaders in regard to free use of material from the forest reserve. Each homesteader near the reserve is entitled to \$20 worth of timber from the national forest each year. Under the regulations of the forestry service, all timber must be marked by a forest officer before it is removed, a permit being issued after such selection.
