BOARD ISSUES LEAFLET

Realty Men Put Their shoulders To The Publicity Wheel.

The Bend Realty Board has just issued a leaflet containing the information on Bend published below, and in addition the business cards of all the members of the organization. These leaflets, of a size convenient for enclosure in envelopes, are being mailed out to inquirers by members of the Board.

Bend, Oregon.

BEND IS WHERE THE RAILROADS, IRRIGATED LANDS, RIVERS AND TIMBER MEET. Trains on the Hill Oregon Trunk Line will be running into Bend by June 1st. The Harriman system has announced the continuation of its line via Bend to connect with the Nation Klammath cut-off.

Bend will be the junction of the east and west Hill line extending across the state for an empire of untouched and unimproved potential wealth—timber, grain, fruit, stock, dairy, garden, mineral and manufactured products.

Bend is a thriving town with a water system, electric lighting system, free library, two schools, a newspaper and many other municipal assets worthy of a far larger town. Bend High School graduates are admitted to the State University without examination. Bend has numerous churches and many secret and benevolent societies. Bend homes are the finest in all Central Oregon.

At Bend is the headquarters of Oregon's largest irrigation company. More than 415,000 acres of irrigated land is adjacent to the town. All this is free. Water rights cost \$40 an acre. The last great homestead country left in America is reached at Bend. More than a QUARTER MILLION ACRES of government land can be had in 100-acre homesteads.

Primary to Bend is TWENTY MILLION feet of yellow pine timber. Great mills will be located here. Bend has 20,000 horse power easily obtainable from the Lewistown river. Already a large power plant is in operation. The climate is ideal.
