BUY BIG TRACT

SEATTLEMEN ACQUIRE GOODWILLIE LAND.

Washington Capitalists Will Make Attractive Residential Park out of Addition to Southeast Which They Are Platting.

The tract of land adjacent to Bend owned by Arthur Goodwillie, formerly of Bend and now living in Chicago, which is commonly known as the "Goodwillie Tract" has been purchased by a group of Seattle men who will make of it a residential addition to Bend.

William D. Cheney, of Seattle, is the most heavily interested of the purchasers, it is understood. With him are associated in the purchase M. S. Leithend, E. B. Summy and William Fehrick, also of Seattle.

The property transferred embraces 280 acres, immediately to the southeast of town. R. B. Gould now is engaged in surveying the land preliminary to platting. The tract, which will be known as Bend Park, will be platted into building lots and half acre tracts, most of it in irregular shaped lots with winding 80-foot boulevards.

It is the intention of the backers of the new addition to make it a high class residential district. While there will be no restriction on the cost of buildings to be erected, purchasers will be required to erect artistic and attractive homes.

Details as to when the property will be on sale, price schedules, etc., as yet are not ready for publication.
