PUSHING AHEAD

MANY BUILDINGS RISE IN BEND.

Nineteen-Room House Near Depot Site Will Soon Be Completed—Work Started on Several Handsome Residences.

With a large number of buildings under construction now and more being planned, Bend shows substantial evidence of a healthful growth. Many persons who contemplate erecting residences or business houses this summer are waiting for the coming of trains, but at present the sound of the carpenter's hammer and saw is heard on all sides.

On Evergreen avenue, only a short distance from the proposed site of the Oregon Trunk depot, H. D. Brown, who came here in March from Portland, is having constructed a nineteen-room building. It is a two-story structure with basement and is being erected as a rooming and apartment house. All the modern conveniences, such as baths, toilet and electric lights, are being installed. The building is nearing completion and will be ready for occupancy by May 15. It was erected at an approximate cost of \$3,000. J. W. Dimick doing the work.

About the middle of next month Councilman W. B. Sellers will begin the erection of a seven-room residence of the bungalow type in Center Addition. It will be placed in the center of two 50-foot lots, with an approximate dimension of 36x40 feet, one and a half stories in height.

Work has commenced on a residence that is being built for G. P. Putnam, on lots 4 and 5 of block 10, in Park Addition, near the Lara house. It will be of the bungalow type, and will have two stories, with floor dimensions 36x44 feet, under half of which there will be a cellar. The building will be shingled.

H. J. Overturf soon will commence the construction of a dwelling in Park Addition next to the Lara residence. Clyde McKay also will build, at an early date, an eight-room bungalow, of one and a half stories, on lots 2 and 3 of block 12, Park Addition.


