DRILLING FOR WATER

For Eighty-five Feet Not a Stone is Struck at Brickyard.

Eighty-five feet without striking even a pebble was the record made by the Central Oregon Well Company, which is drilling for water at August 3, 4, 5, 14, 15, 16, 17, 21, the brickyard three miles west of town. 
