The Bulletin is informed, on the best authority, that the U. S. Post-office Department will receive no bids for the carrying of mail from Calver to Bend after July 1, for which service a call for bids has been issued. At least, no company new in the field, or equipped to handle the work, will try for the contract, which at best must be most temporary. Will this mean that Bend continues to get its mail 24 hours late, via Shaniko, until the completion of the railroad to here—and probably for some time thereafter?

In a somewhat dismal wail the Malheur Enterprise invokes the curse of Heaven upon the Bend-Burns road, calls attention to the multifold attractions Vale has for the freighters to whom "no other town will ever be so homelike," and incidentally refers to "little swell-headed Bend." He who laughs last gets the most enjoyment; and perhaps a sorehead is a sadder spectacle than a swell head!

A new census taken at Klamath Falls by a representative committee of business men, shows the population of that place to be 5,210, as contrasted with 2758, the figure arrived at by the Government enumerators.

If the proposed southern trip of the Bend Commercial Club is half the success the Burns excursion proved, it will be indeed another proof of Bend's preeminent get-up-get-ness.

**CHICKENS WITH LAND**

Novel Plan to Be Employed in Sale of New Addition to City.

One hundred chickens with every acre is the novel inducement which will be made purchasers in Junction Park, the latest addition to Bend to be placed on the market. This property is a 160-acre tract cornering on South Bend, which has been platted and is now on sale in 5 and 10 acre tracts. Charles E. Reed is the owner and J. A. Eastes will handle the property. Mr. Reed has been residing in Sutherlin, Ore., but is now in Bend and will make his home here.

Mr. Reed's idea in giving 500 chickens with every 5 acre tract and 1000 with every 10 acres is to encourage the raising of poultry at Bend. He says he will sell the acreage on terms in order that the purchasers may pay for their land by the profits obtained from their chickens.

**WATER IN LATERALS**

Arnold Company's Ditches Commence Serving Many Acres.

This week water is turned into the North Lateral of the Arnold Irrigation Company's system as far as Ed Halvorson's place, about 7 miles from the headgate. Chas. Sipech, Ed. Brosterhouse, J. S. Parminter, Fred Hunnell, J. H. Oneil, A. L. Goodwillie and Ed Halvorson own lands that will be watered, a total of about 1000 acres.

The Pine Forest lateral also will receive water this week, states Engineer Wiest, E. A. Knotts, Wm. Arnold and Gten H. Slack owning lands to which the water will reach.
