MAKING PLANS

WOOLEN MILL HEAD IS HEARD FROM.

Dr. F. J. Bailey Says His Company Will Make Quick Job of Building When Road is Opened—Will Arrive Here Tonight.

Preparations for the building of the woolen mill here are going ahead according to a letter received by Manager Sawhill of the Commercial Club from Dr. F. J. Bailey of Portland. The letter was read to the City Council last night and in part is as follows:

It will be necessary for you first to adopt your charter and in it provide for bonded indebtedness; this is all that is necessary so far as the charter is concerned. You can then hold your special election for the bonds.

This seems to me to be the only way that will be safe in view of the limitations placed on incorporated towns and the mixup that might follow taking it up any other way.

As I remember the looks of the country there, I think the location of the power and mill site as selected by you will be entirely satisfactory to me.

I will have things arranged here shortly so that I can come down to Bend and we can then go over the details of the matter and close it in its entirety.

We are going ahead with our arrangements, plans, etc. for going to Bend on the assumption that everything will go through as we planned, and will be ready to make a quick job of it when the road is completed.

Dr. Bailey is expected in Bend tonight and will go with the Commercial Club party through Southern Oregon.

Before Judge Bradshaw at The Dalles on June 22 or 23 a motion to dissolve the injunction proceedings brought by A. A. Anthony and Mary Kelly against the Oregon Trunk Railway, to prevent the building of the Lyle spur, will be heard. The procedure will be on affidavits. Should the matter not be settled in this way, it will be referred to a referee to take testimony. The plaintiffs will be represented by C. S. Benson and the railway by Harrison Allen, O. T. attorney, and Vernon A. Forbes.
