ROAD SURVEYED

CRESCENT-SILVER LAKE HIGHWAY

Grade will be Easy and New Way will
Save 15 Miles—Sayer Visits
Crescent Commercial Club
—Other News Notes.

CRESCENT, June 20—The board of review for the new road from Crescent to Fort Rock and Silver Lake has finished its survey under direction of Deputy McConnell and has recommended the immediate construction of the highway. The road runs nearly east from here and crosses the Silver Lake stage road about four miles northwest of the stage station. It is about two miles from there to the Lake county line where Lake county will connect its road with the one projected by Klamath county. There is a saving of nearly 15 miles and the grade is easy the entire distance.

A dance was given last Thursday evening at Kaiser's hall, complimentary to Miss Maude Gallogly of Portland, teacher of the Crescent school.

Work at Odell ranger station has been completed and the workmen are now employed on the supervisor's office at Crescent.

Brackett & Funk have about completed the remodeling of the William Baldwin building on Railroad avenue and will shortly open a billiard and pool hall, the equipment having arrived from Portland.

Alf Aldrich of Bend and O. Poindecker of Prineville are busily engaged at Odell lake, preparing the hotel and boats for the fishing season which will soon begin. The outlook is for a greater number of visitors than ever at Lakes Odell and Crescent, this summer.

RAY SCHOOL DIRECTOR

Former Member of Board Chosen
Again—Wiest Re-elected Clerk.

F. M. Ray, who resigned from the School Board this spring when he moved outside the limits of the school district, was elected Monday for a three-year term, having returned to town to reside. Levi D. Wiest was re-elected clerk of the board for a one-year term.

The election was held at the school house Monday afternoon. Mr. Ray received 35 votes, C. I. Bozell 7, and C. D. Rowe 5. Mr. Rowe asked that his name be withdrawn after he had received 5 votes. Mr. Wiest got 32 votes, J. I. West 3, J. M. Lawrence 8 and Miss Gertrude Markel 2, for clerk.

A summary of the board's annual report was read at the meeting. It will be printed in full in next week's Bulletin.
