**PASS ON CHARTER**

**PORTLAND ATTORNEYS TO GO OVER IT**

Mayor Coe Left Sunday for Rose City Taking Copy of Instrument--Pilot Butte Canal to Be Bridged at Eighth Street--Call for Bids

Make a charter in haste and repent at leisure is something Bend will not do. The Common Council met in special session Friday evening to take final action, but it was decided that it would be a wise plan to have some bond and corporation lawyer of Portland go over the charter as drafted and examine all parts to see that they are legally drawn and that bonds, when issued, will be entirely valid and marketable. Mayor Coe, who left Sunday for Portland, took the instrument with him. He will return Saturday and the matter will be taken up again at an adjourned session on August 2. Several suggestions on the wording of the charter were received from Bend residents.

There was some discussion of a commission form of government for the city at the meeting Friday, but no action was taken.

The Lytle Townsite Co. and L. D. West having agreed to furnish the material for the building of a bridge across the Pilot Butte canal at Eighth street, the street committee was instructed to get up designs and advertise for bids.

Recorder Ellis was also instructed to have R. B. Gould take up with the Bend Park Co. the matter of a bridge over the canal at Koa avenue. If the company will furnish the lumber, the city will bear the expense of construction.

**ESKIMO FAMILY LIFE.**

A Glimpse of the Home When White Guests Are Present.

The usual sights on entering an Eskimo habitation are: On the way opposite to a steamer-like berth covered with skins--the sleeping quarters of the family; underneath, or in front, sit one or two women, busily sewing; to the right, a man making hunting gear. Never will you find an Eskimo family idle. All occupants are naked to the waist, sometimes only covered with a loin cloth. Along the wall on either side burn several lamps. These lamps are shallow soapstone basins filled with the oil of the seal, whale or walrus; along the edge is placed a little ridge of moss, which answers the purpose of the wick in our lamps. The lamps do not smoke, and, besides illuminating, throw a great heat. Above the flame hangs a piece of blubber, to replenish the oil, also a tea kettle.

You are cordially invited to take off your things and stay awhile. This means drinking to the same extent, for the air is foul and the temperature that of a Turkish bath. If you come during meal time, which is at any hour of the day, you are cordially invited to partake; you decline and no offense is given. If the meal consists of frozen fish, blubber or something they know the white man abhors, some joker will especially entreat you to join the dish and then there is a great laugh all around. The Eskimo loves to laugh, play practical jokes on his friends, respond in witicism and is of a happy, childlike disposition. Treachery, stealing and lying are practically unknown among them, the two latter only since some of them have imitated the white man. I am not including the Siberian, Greenland or Labrador Eskimo.
