### DEBATING BEGUN BY STUDENTS

The decision of the three judges, Robert Innes, Ivan McGillvray and Claude Vandevent, was in favor of the affirmative. Those on the affirmative side were Margaret Wiest and Lawrence Smith, while on the negative were Emily Schreder and Fred Lucas.

A second debate was held last Friday afternoon. The question was: "Resolved, that women should have the ballot." Those debating were: Affirmative, Harry Spining and Clyde McGillvray; negative, Hellen Bozell and Claude Kelly. The decision was in favor of the negative. The debate was preceded by a violin solo by Robert Innes.

Singing has been instituted in the High School in the time reserved for morning exercises, Miss Borden acting as organist.

The Senior Class has had its first business meeting at which class officers were elected. Those chosen are: President, Emily Schreder; secretary and treasurer, Margaret Wiest.

Great interest has been created among the B. H. S. boys in athletics. They have organized a football team and practice almost every evening. They also have contests at recess, especially in racing and ball throwing.

The Junior and Freshman classes

have organized for the year. The officers of the former are: President, Claude Vandevent; secretary, Ivan McGillvray. Those of the latter are: President, Ruth Caldwell; vice president, Clarence Sather; secretary and treasurer, Hugh Thompson.

### MAYOR THREATENED
