LAND IS OPENED

**Government Restores Townships 14
and 15, Ranges 18 and 19**

The 32,900 acres of additional public domain in Crook county to be opened to homestead entry, as previously noted in The Bulletin, is located in townships 14 and 15, south, ranges 18 and 19. In the legal notice of restoration, the Government says: "Warning is hereby expressly given that no person will be permitted to gain or exercise any right whatever under any settlement or occupation begun after withdrawal and prior to 9 a. m., January 2, 1912, and all such settlement or occupancy is forbidden." The land will not be subject to "entry, filing or selection until on and after Feb. 2, 1912, at the U. S. land office at The Dalles."
