

Dougias Jerrold tackled it when he

was just recovering from an illness and despairingly set down his inability to comprehend it to the probability that his mind was impaired by disease, and, thrusting the book into the hands of his wife, he entreated her to read it at once. He watched her breathlessig and when she excisimed, "I don't know what this means; it is gibberish." Jerrold exclaimed, "Thank God, I am not an idlot."

A French critic, Odyme Barot, quotes a passage where the poet says, "God gave man two faculties," and adds, "I wish while he was about it God had. supplied another-namely, the power of understanding Mr. Browning." Mrs. Carlyle declared that she read "Bordello" attentively twice, but was unable to discover whether the title referred to "a man, a city or a tree."

SNAKES ARE USEFUL.

They Are a Check Upon the Lesser Reptiles of the Tropics.

What is the use of enskes? In their "going on their belly," the circumstance that so offended Bacon, lies one of their greatest uses, because that, together with their internal formation and external covering, enables them to penetrate where no larger carnivorous animal could venture, into dark and noisome morasses, bog jungles, swamps amid the tangied vegetation of the tropics, where swarms of the lesser reptiles, on which so many of them feed, would otherwise outbalance the harmony of nature,

Wondrously and exquisitely con-structed for their habitat, they are able to exist where the higher animals could not, and, while they help to clear those inaccessible places of the lesser vermin, they themselves supply food for a number of the smaller mamma lis, which, with many carnivorous birds, devour vast numbers of young snakes

The hedgehog, weasel, ichneumon, rat, peccary, badger, goat, bog and an immense number of birds keep anakes within due limits, while the latter perform their part among the grain devouring and herbivorous lesser creatures .- Harper's Weekly.

A Notable Day's Work.

Robert Burns composed his master-piece, "Tam o' Shauter," in one day in the open air. Burns went out of the house in the morning and, not return ing, his wife joined him in the afternoon with her two children. Beeing that he was "crooning to himsol'," she forebore to interrupt him, but stayed in the fields at a distance, where she could see him. She observed him wildly gesticulating and at times fairly leaning with joy. She said to Allan Cunningham, the poet, after her hus-band's death, "I wisht ye had seen him; he was in such ecstasy that the tears were happing down his cheeks." He committed the poem to writing by the riverside and went into the house and read it to his wife at the fireside with great triumph-one of the most notable day's work ever done in Scotinnd!


