ASSESSMENTS DUE

Water Users' Association Members to Contribute to Organization

Pursuant to the provisions of article 4 of the organizations' bylaws, last week Secretary Sayder of she Central Oregon Irrigation Company Water Users' Association mailed a communication to every member requesting them to pay asessments in arrears.

The article in question reads as follows:

Section 4 .- The Board of Directers shall within five days of the levyng of any assessment cause written otice thereof to be sent by mail to all persons against whom such asesament has been levied, stating he amount and date thereof and the person to whom the same is payable. f any member shall neglect or reuse to pay any assessment duly evied against him by the Board of Directors for a period of 30 days after written notice thereof has been gent to his address, then the Board of Directors shall have the right to proceed to collect the same by proess of law. And every person signog these By-Laws expressly agrees o pay all assessments duly levied gainst him in accordance with the provisions therefor of any amendent thereto and expressly agrees that such assessments, together with able costs of collection thereof hall be a personal obligation against im and against his property and shall constitute a lieu on all lands urchased or contracted for by him inder the provisions of the Carey act in the segregation of the Central Dregon Irrigation Company.
