BUTTE SCHOOL DIS TRICT NOT INJURED

Attack on County Officials For Ac tion That Never Happened, Shown up by School Superintendent. Publication Perhaps Hiegal.

What County Superintendent of Education R. A. Ford and others familiar with the facts of the case characterize as a malicious and groundless misstatement apeared in a Princyllle paper last week in the form of a communication to the edi-

The letter in question was to the effect that the county boundary board had illegally and unfairly deprived Butte Valley school district, No. 72, of a portion of its territory, adding the alleged stolen lands to the Bend

Ford Makes Statement.

The absurdity of the complaint is evidenced by a vigorous statement by Prof. Ford to The Bulletin.

There has been absolutely no Butte Valley district since June 2, 1908, when the present boundaries were fixed under County Judge Bell, and Dinwiddle," said Mr. Ford.
The district is aproximately 27

miles long, north and south.

The county superintendent went on to say some very pointed things about the trickery of making such totally truthless and unfounded charges on the eve of the primary election when they are calculated to harm Judge Eilis and when it is difficult to get the truth of the matter to the voters in time.

"Unless I am gravely mistaken," continued Mr. Ford, "the paper (Crook County Journal) which printed the so-called letter is liable for prosecution under the corrupt practices act. A provision of the law requires that when damaging statements are made, whether with truth or malignant falseness, as is aparently the case in this instance, the political candidate involved must be no tified of the alleged charges against them at least 15 days before the publication of same. A year's imprison-ment is the minimum penalty for tion of this provision.
