BEND GIRLS WIN AT BASKET BALL

Bend came back in a moment with a foul goal and tied the game. The spectators became greatly enthused and the twelve girls played with all their energy. There were many tumbles, but no one got burt and there was no rough play-The visitors found it difficult to keep their feet on the slippery floor, and a large number of the fouls called on them were for sliding across the boundary lines. Miss Noble, playing guard for Prineville. worked so hard that she became exhausted and had to quit the game. Miss Livingston went from center to forward and Miss Dobbs was sent In to play center.

Bend's first field goal did not come till the second half was well along. The forwards seemed unable to get the ball into the banket when they had chances. However, the work of the guards on both sides was excellent, they being responsible in great part for the few goals from the field. Miss Black started the field scoring for Bend, and after that Prineville had no chance to win. Miss Young followed this with another goal and the final score for the locals was 15 points. Princyille succeeded in getting another goal, which made their total number of points 7.
