LA PINE PAPER SAYS NICE THINGS

Bend Attorney Came Here With La Follette and Since Has Been Climbing Rapidly in Law and Politics.

From practical obscurity to one of the most prominent men in Central Oregon, is the enviable position attained by Vernon A. Forbes in a little over two years.

On his way to Bend from Nampa, Idaho, in the latter part of December, 1909, G. E. La Follette, brother of the Inter-Mountain editor, stopped at Madras one night. The next morning while collecting his grips to board the stage, a young man sitting in the lobby of the hotel greeted him with the inquiry, "Say, where are you going?" "To Bend," was the

reply. "Well, I believe I'll go too." The young chap was Forbes. He had graduated from a law school a few months before and was entering Central Oregon to start into business for himself.

They were roommates in a hotel at Bend for several weeks. Forbes "offering" in the room in the hotel in the meantime. About the middle of March, La Follette left Bend to become resident agent for the town-site company at Crescent, but Forbes remained.

At the last term of circuit court at Prineville this young attorney had more cases than any other one lawyer in Crook county.

ANOTHER IRRIGATION PROJECT.

SALEM, May 6.—Another large irrigating project in Crook county was foreseen when C. W. Allen made application for 600 second feet of water at the source of Metolius river, where it gushes from the base of Black Butte. The project is to carry water in a canal for seven miles along the river, then by tunnel through the divide for two and a quarter miles, which will make water available to 50,000 acres on the west of the Deschutes river and south of Warm Springs reservation. The land is all privately owned.
