

## ROUTE CHANGE IS NOT WANTED

### BROOKINGS OBJECTS TO SCHREDER'S PLAN

Settler Says Crook County Should Improve Present Burns Road, Including Stretch in Lake County, and Try no Relocation.

That people in the southeast home-stead country are far from united as regards the best course to follow regarding roads in their territory is indicated by a letter received by the Commercial Club from Horace Brookings, a well known settler. Mr. Brookings objects to a letter from V. Schreder which was published in The Bulletin of May 1st. Mr. Schreder urged the abandonment of that portion of the Bend-Burns road which lies in Lake county, and a partial relocation of the route.

**The Brookings Letter.**  
Mr. Brookings' letter, in part, is as follows:

"I will say that it will cost more to build one half mile of this road (the one proposed by Schreder) than it would to fix all of the road in Lake county and put that part in good condition for two years. There is one mile of this proposed road that is similar to the road at Trail Crossing on the Crooked River. There are four or five families that would be benefited by this new road, but there are 30 families in Lost Creek Valley, Wagon tire and Iron Mountain, that are effected if the road is changed. I have personally traveled through the proposed route and to my belief it is 3 to 5 miles longer than the present road. I understand that the Court of Harney county has ordered the grader out to work the road as far as Cooks. This will leave about 2 miles in Lake county for Crook county to work.

"The road from here to Lake county is in a bad condition and needs to be fixed. I am satisfied that Crook county will never offer to build the newly proposed road, after the route is inspected and as none of the signers of the petition have ever been over the route proposed.

"I ask in the interest of the business men of Bend and Burns and traffic now using the Bend-Burns road that the Bend Commercial Club send a committee out to investigate this new proposed route, so that Crook county can get to work.

"Crook county is under obligation to the settlers of Lake county who do their trading in Crook county. The tax payers in Crook county signed a petition for this Bend-Burns road

which was known to the officials of Crook county to cut across a corner of Lake county.

"I am not opposed to the proposed new road as a wagon road but as to a Bend-Burns road it certainly would be a detriment to auto travel on account of steep hills."

**Object to Road Work.**  
In connection with this matter, recently there have been some complaints regarding the methods followed by the crew that is working the Bend-Burns road. Auto owners declare that a 30-foot wide space is being grubbed of sagebrush, thus allowing sand to blow and injure the road without really improving the route. It is their contention that a more important work is to take out stones and high centers and fill chuck holes. On the other hand, settlers have reported satisfaction with the work as it is progressing.

Beginning May 23rd and terminating August 20th, 1912, this company will install a system of rotation in the distribution of water for irrigation. The dates of delivery and the amount of water for rotation head will be furnished you by the ditch rider in your district. It is our intention to commence deliveries at the lower end of each lateral.

We trust that you will cooperate with us for an improved service. Enlarge your ditches to receive an irrigation head of at least 3 second feet, and provide storage for domestic use, as water will be shut off entirely during the time your neighbors are irrigating.
