Explains Patterson Decision

BEND, Ore., May 14.—(To the Editor)—In view of a disposition in some quarters to criticize the course of the authorities in the criminal case against Ralph Patterson involving Irene Page, a few words of explanation seem proper. When the grand jury left out of the indictment the words, "the daughter of his wife," the least penalty was thereby reduced from 20 years in the penitentiary to 3 years. It was found that Patterson would plead guilty to the indictment in that form, whereas he probably would not if the five words were retained. From the nature of the case there was no direct testimony except that of the girl, which the defendant would of course deny, thus leaving to the jury to decide between the two, each testifying contrary to the other, and there could be no certainty that the jury in such circumstances would convict. Moreover, it was very desirable to avoid the demoralizing effect upon the girl which publicly testifying to all the facts requisite in law for conviction would have produced. So it was deemed best for the less offense, take the plea of guilty and close the distressing case, and this was done.

In sentencing Patterson, Judge Bradshaw expressed regret that the law gave him no power to fix the penalty greater than an indeterminate term of 3 to 20 years. This, of course was after the prisoner had pleaded guilty and there was left no room for doubt upon the point. Prior to such plea he was legally entitled to the benefit of doubt and neither court nor jury could presume guilt without convincing proof.
