COUNCIL SPLITS LUM-BER ORDER

Steidt Says Clean Alleys-Chemical Fire Engine to Be Tested-Semi-Annual Liquor License Due July 1-Other Matters.

With Allen, Lattin, Steldl. Spencer and Putnam present, the city council met Friday night.

An ordinance establishing street grades was read for the first time. Bids for 10,000 feet of lumber, to be used by the city for crosswalks and other purposes, were received from The Bend Company and the Overturf-Davis-Miller Co. The prices of the two were practically identical, and on metion of Chairman Spencer of the street committee, it was ordered that half of the purchase be made from each company.

Chairman Steldl of the health committee reported that in certain alleys in the city unhealthy conditions existed because property owners neglected to have tollets cleaned out. The chief of police was instructed to make examination with Mr. Steid! and order, when necessary, that a clean-up be made, owners failing to do which the city would do the work and charge it against the property.

On motion, the recorder was instructed to order L. A. Shaw to install a brick flue in his building on the corner of Bond and Oregon streets, in accordance with the recently enacted fire ordinance.

Will Test Chemical Engine.

After informal discussion, the mayor instructed Chief Roberts to fet the chemical fire engine in working order, and to give a demonstration test tomorrow(Thursday) evening, near the ball grounds, where a fire of boxes will be set and worked

The liquor license matter was talked over and it was decided to proceed in exact accordance with the existing ordinance, namely, collect \$400 lisix months.

Special policemen are to be appointed over the Fourth celebration, and the mayor stated that probably a couple of plain clothes men would

be appointed to aid in the strict preservation of order, should occasion Adjournment was taken until 8:30


