

COUNCIL DOES ROUTINE WORK

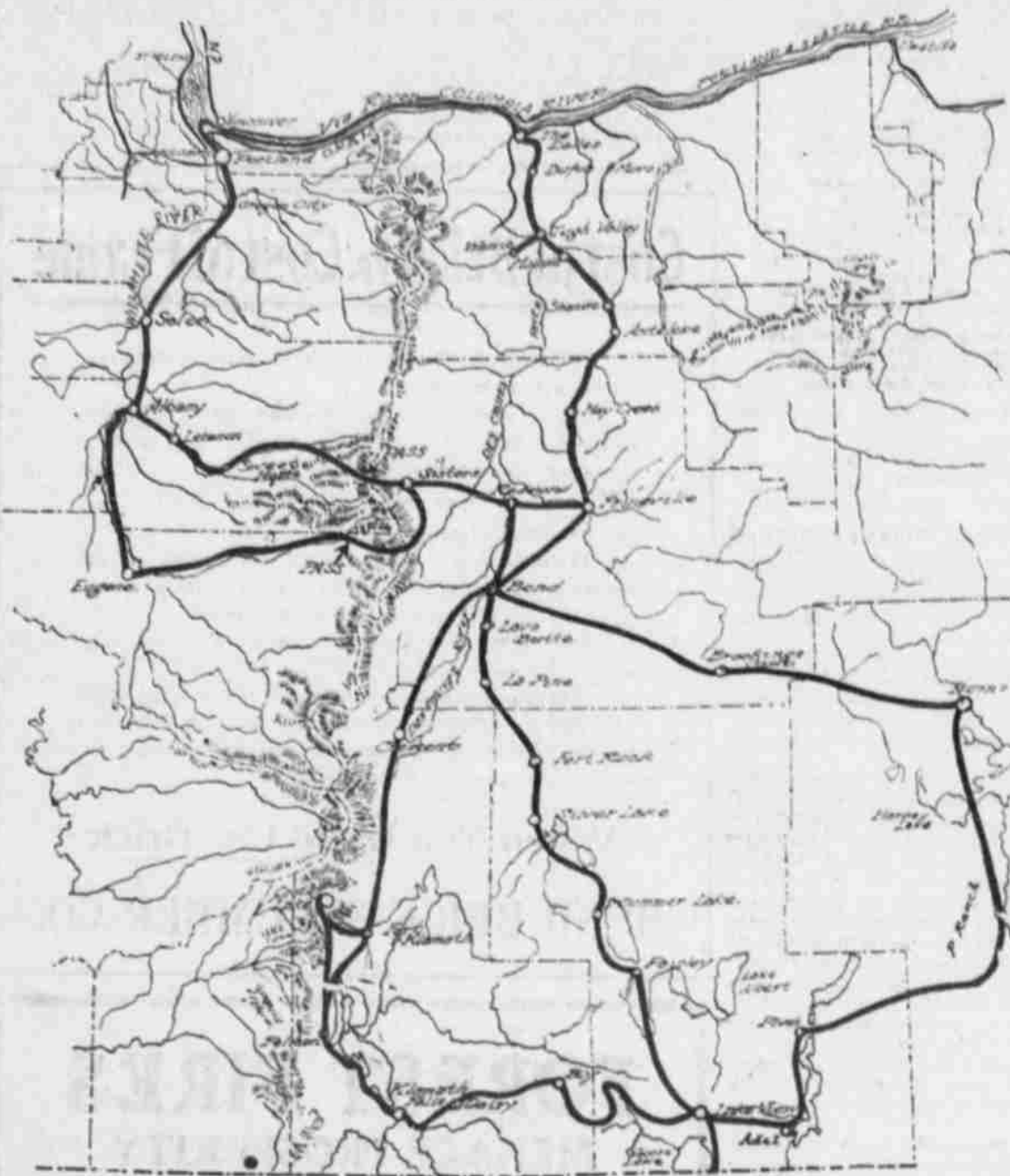

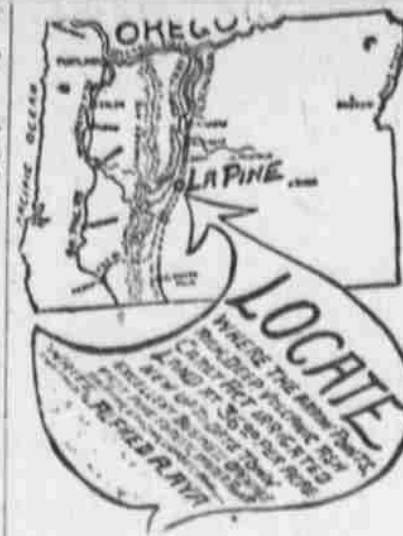


Map Showing Routes to Be Followed By Portland Parties in August.
