### NOTICE OF CONTEST.

Department of the Interior, United States Land Office, The Dalles, Oregon, July 10, 1912.

To Harry Emery, of Bend, Oregon, Contestee:

You are hereby notified that I. L. Owen, who gives Bend, Oregon, as his postoffice address, did on June 4, 1912, file in this office his duly corroborated application to contest and secure the cancellation of your homestead, Entry No. .... Serial No. 08289, made March 27, 1911, for SW 1/4, Sec. 8, NW 1/4, Section 17, Township 20, S. Range 15, E. Willamette Meridian, and as grounds for his contest he alleges that said Harry Emery has not established any residence on said land nor made any improvements on said land as required by law nor has the said Harry Emery been on said land within six months prior to October 15, 1911, having apparently abandoned said land.

You are, therefore, further notified that the said allegations will be taken by this office as having been confessed by you, and your said entry will be canceled thereunder without your further right to be heard therein, either before this office or on appeal, if you fail to file in this office within twenty days after the FOURTH publication of this notice, as shown below, your answer, under oath, specifically meeting and responding to these allegations of contest, or if you fail within that time to file in this office due proof that you have served a copy of your answer on the said contestant either in person or by registered mail. If service is made by the delivery of a copy of your answer to the contestant in person, proof of such service must be either the said contestant's written acknowledgement or his receipt of the copy, showing the date of its receipt, or the affidavit of the person by whom the delivery was made stating when and where the copy was delivered; if made by registered mail, proof of such service must consist of the affidavit of the person by whom the copy was mailed stating when and the post office to which it was mailed, and this affidavit must be accompanied by the postmaster's receipt for the letter.

You should state in your answer the name of the post office to which you desire future notices to be sent to you.
