HELP LAIDLAW.

The people of Laidlaw have taken the bit in their teeth. In times past they have petitioned for some satisfactory settlement of the difficulties connected with the Columbia Southern irrigation enterprise that have held back the merited development of their territory.

In brief, they propose that they be allowed to conduct their own affairs, and that the state aid them by furnishing the capital with which to buy the bonds issued by their proposed irrigation district.

The history of the Columbia Southern project is too well known to require repetition. In a nutshell, the settlers have been the "goats." Either maliciously or otherwise, the state authorities in the past have neglected to get any action.

Today the important point is this: The Laidlaw people have a fight ahead of them. Their affairs will be up for discussion before the legislature. If they win, as justice demands they do, their victory will be a victory for the entire section.

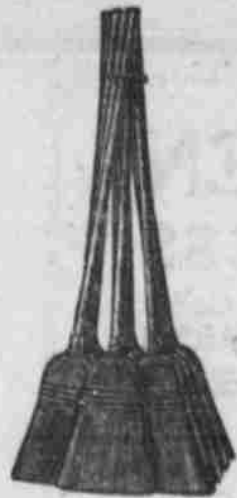
The people of Bend should, and we believe they will, aid Laidlaw settlers all they can.

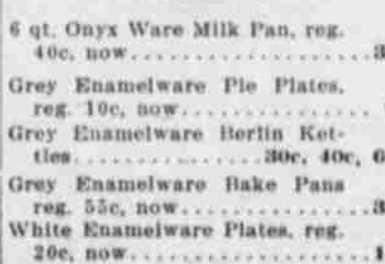
