

BEND'S FIRST SCHOOL BOY RETURNS TO TOWN

Frank Harrison, Pupil at Staats Place 17 Years Ago, Has Hard Time Locating Land Marks Here.

The first pupil that attended a school in Bend returned here Saturday, after an absence of 16 years. His name is Frank Harrison, and for the last eight years he has lived at Burns, where he has conducted a barber shop.

It was 27 years ago when Harrison first tackled reading, writing and arithmetic in one end of the old Staats cabin about a mile south of the present town, where the first school room was. The only other schoolboy was Frank Hubbard. J. T. Robinson, now of Haystack, was teacher. The only men living there then were Billy Staats and John Sismore. Harrison's father had a ranch where the Wimer place is now.

When he landed in town Friday Harrison tried to hunt down some familiar land marks, but was completely at sea until he located the old log school house, where he went later after the first experience at the Staats place. Then he chanced to meet Mr. Staats, who took him in tow and showed him "where he was at."

Harrison is now 37; when he first attended school here he was 10.
