Lane Ahead in County.

Lane carries the county for Senator, with 451 votes in 18 precincts. Bourne gets 219 and Selling 401. Sinnott runs ahead of Graham for Congress by 642 votes to 397. Bell is elected district attorney, it seems, He carries the county with 679 votes in 18 precincts, against 536 for Clerk-Barnes 16, Brown 99, Allen. V. A. Forbes of Bend is elected state representative easily.

Woman is Defeated. The first woman candidate to seek ciltical office, Mrs. Della W. Nichola of Laidlaw, went down to defeat for chool superintendent. In 18 precincts she polled 416 votes against 988 for Myera.
