

number of citizens with a permanent and well\_ equipped telephone system and for the purpose of said construction it is necessary that said company have an easement, right of way and franchise as herein petitioned for:

It is hereby ordered that the said Farmers' Mutual Telephone Company be granted a franchise and right of way over and along all roads and highways within said county for the purpose of erecting the system of poles and wires for telephoning as requested herein and as may be necessary to fully and adequately equip a telephone system for satisfactory service to citizens of Crook County; all of such poles and wires to be erected so as not to interfere with or hinder or obstruct other electric or telephone systems that may now or hereafter be lawfully operated and maintained on said roads and public highways; and that in so far as is practicable said poles and wires shall occupy but one side of the road or highway and that where said poles and wires shall cross any public highway said wires shall be at least 20 feet above the ground and said company shall hold and keep Crook County whole and harmless from all damage which may accrue to parsons or property by virtue of the construction or operation or main tenance of anid system upon said roads and highways of Erook county.
