notice of the presentation of said petition was made as provided by law and all proceedings therein had having been referred to the district attorney as provided by law and having been returned with his approval and being found regular, it is ordered that the board of road viewers meet at the beginning of said road on the 4th day of April, 1913, view, review and survey said road and report thereon at the next regular term of this court.

In the matter of the petition of R. A. Merchant et al for a county road same proceedings had as supra except that board of road viewers was ordered to meet at beginning of said road on the 8th day of April, 1913, to view, review and survey said road.

In the matter of the petition of S. E. West et al for a county road same proceedings had as in OGG road supra except that board of road viewers ordered to meet at the beginning of said road on the 17th day of April, 1913, to view, review and survey said road.

In the matter of the petition of D. G. Hyram et al for a county road same proceedings had as in OGG road supra except that the board of road viewers is ordered to meet at the beginning of said road on the 21st day of April, 1913, to view, review and survey said road.
