County Judge Informed That Merchants Sell to Minors.

The Bulletin has received the following communication from the county judge's office:

a number of parents: 'Dear Sir: It has been reported to the Juvenile Court of this county that a number of boys under the age of eighteen are violating a state law regarding the use of tobacco in any form by a minor in public (Sec. 2149 L. O. L.). Your boy is among the number, so in order to save yourself and him future trouble, we would advise that you take steps to correct this evil tendency on his part. If you can ascertain from what source your boy obtains tobacco, we shall be glad to cooperate with you in enforcing the law against those who are knowingly contributing to the delinquency of a minor by furnishing him tobacco without the consent of his parents or guardian. (Sec. 2148, 2150, L. O. L.)

NORTH PORTLAND, April 11. Receipts for the week have been: Cattle 1670, calves 156, hogs 3226, sheep 2573, horses 8. Market steady To John H. Williams, of Sumner, a shade lower. The yards were filled with a very liberal run. Trading was extremely active the first of Only one load of prime \$7.90. Weight decreased and beef quality graded medium good, Butchranged between \$6.50 and \$7 with a few small lots realizing over seven with demand not so urgent. Extreme year last past. quotations are \$8 to \$8.15 for best steers, \$7 to \$7.15 for cows, \$6 to \$6.25 for bulls and \$8.75 for calves. The hog market was shattered in quick time after buyers commenced hammering the high level of last week. Falling Eastern markets, together with liberal liquidation gave them an opportunity to lower bids and there after the decline was rapid. From the unsteady Monday top of \$9.60 prices hit bottom at \$9.30 on Wednesday and Thursday where it settled temporarily at least. All grades of swine decreased proportionately with the best light variety and is still on unsteady basis. Mutton buying was limited to a half dezen cars of wethers, ewes and lambs. all selling at recent high prices. Wool wethers at \$7.25 and ewes at \$6.25 indicate the range in prime Best lambs sell easily at \$8. Sheared stock a dellar less.
