

BILL RODGERS WAS A TRAPPER

BEAVER CAPTAIN TELLS OF WINTER

Portland Baseball Chief, Who Camped on Upper Deschutes, Now Featured as Mighty Road Builder for the La Pine Folks.

The following is extracted from an Oregonian article recounting the exploits last winter of Bill Rodgers, captain of the Portland Beaver baseball team:

For the past two winters Rodgers has been delving into the wilds of Oregon in search of excitement, game and pelts. Last year the trip was much more arduous, so Bill sent Mrs. Rodgers East and hooked up with Bill Shangle, a veteran trapper, for a long stay to the Cascades near the headwaters of the Deschutes.

Five camps, 75 miles from Bend and to the southwest, were the center of the activity of the two Bills, Shangle and Rodgers.

At these five camps, the highest one being on 15 feet of snow at the top of the Cascades, lines of traps to the number of 150 extended for 20 miles.

"When we left the wickiup, our main camp, and went to our Crane Prairie camp, 12 miles up the mountains, Graft and I, who went into partnership to trap martens, were snowbound from January 2 to January 25," says the ballplayer-trapper.

After the storm had subsided the duo started out for La Pine to get 500 pounds of provisions. When they arrived at the town, a side trip was undertaken, Rodgers and Graft figuring as roadbuilders.

La Pine people were anxious to have a road opened from their town to East Lake, where a hotel is to be built at the hot springs. They prevailed on Rodgers and Graft to undertake the job, so for a week the two skilled for 18 miles between the two points seeking for a favorable grade for a road.

The trip was successful and the La Pine people have promised to name the road "Rodgers Road."

WEEKLY MARKET REPORT.
NORTH PORTLAND, April 25.
Receipts for the week have been: Cattle 1522, calves 24, hogs 1680, sheep 842, horses 67.

A steadier cattle market due to a large proportion of well finished steers. Top load during the six days sold at \$8.15, others at \$8 and \$8.10. Bulk top is just steady at \$8. Butcher stock has been comparatively scarce and all lines firmer. Beef liquidation was liberal and outlet is none too broad. Medium and poor stuff is difficult to sell at any price. Steers at \$5, cows \$7, bulls \$6 and calves \$9 are extreme levels in the cattle market. Swine trade suffered further losses this week which would have been more severe had not receipts been small. \$5.75 is considered a liberal top with an occasional sale at \$5.55. Tendency is downward and market circles pessimistic. Another slow week in the sheep house featured only by an \$8.75 lamb transaction. All mutton classes are strong. Demand is good and prices on firm basis.
