Another Farmer Relates His Experiences of Feeding Hogs.

There is no reason why they should not be a valuable food, but I am confident that much better results would have been the outcome if they had been cooked even whole and fed to the hogs, as I have seen at home many times. At all events, it will put on flesh quicker and I think would take less grain.

PORTLAND, Ore., April 19.—To the Editor of the Journal—Noting an inquiry in your columns as to the value of potatoes for feed, I will say that my own experience proves them to be of great value. Necessity enlightened me to the fact. In the '50s, at my ranch at Nestucca, Tillamook county, we experienced a very severe winter, with deep snow, and as plowmen were not well prepared to care for the stock, having hardly any feed but grass and a little hay. But we had plenty of potatoes. I had to feed my horses with a spare sack or two of flour. I cooked the potatoes and mixed a little flour and a little salt to tempt them. They got used to it at last and were fed all the winter. In the spring I noticed that they shed off sooner and I never saw horses look more sleek and healthy. When using them, in pulling up the mountain, I noticed that they had better and longer wind, and never seemed to tire.
But I am of the opinion that, fed raw, potatoes have no value or very little, except to clean out the worms that infest the stomachs of many animals. Potatoes should always be cooked.
