SQUAW CREEK CLAIMS TABULATED

Report on Investigation Started in November, 1911.—All Priorities Established—Certificates Will Be Considered by the Court.

Through the courtesy of G. H. Brewster, The Bulletin is able to publish the following tabulation of the determination of water rights in Squaw Creek. In 1911, 7622 acres of land irrigated from Squaw Creek obtained certificates. The amount involved here is 7512 acres. If all the lands shown on the maps were granted water rights, there would be a total of about 15,500 acres to be supplied by the waters of Squaw Creek.

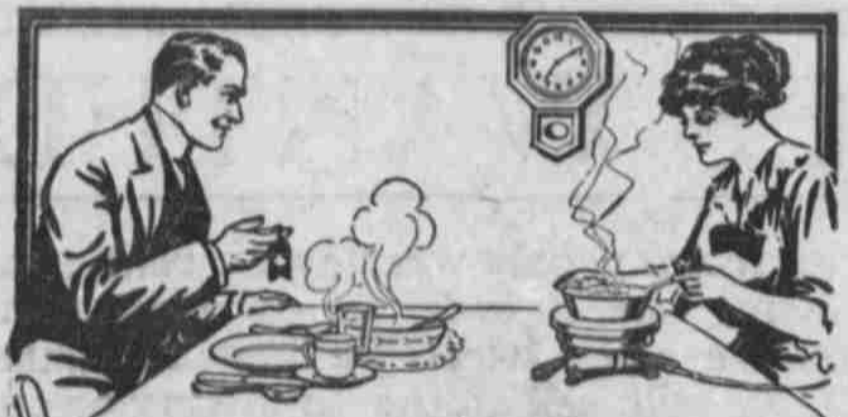
